SUBJECT and (ALLEGED) OFFENSE HISTORY

Juozas "Joseph" KISIELAITIS was born on 23 November 1920 in Lithuania.

During 1941, Kisielaitis volunteered¹ for the Lithuanian 2nd "Auxiliary Police Service Battalion" (later known as the 12th Lithuanian Schutzmannschaft Battalion)². Although Kisielaitis claims to have been a "tailor", assigned to the Battalion's Headquarters area, documents in the possession of the U.S. and Canadian governments appear to show that Kisielaitis was in fact a "rifleman"³.

During 1941 and 1942, Kisielaitis' battalion assisted in the murder of at least 130,000, primarily Jewish, men, women and children in Lithuania and elsewhere.

"... The various companies of the Battalion for the Defense of National Labor were then reorganized to serve German purposes, under the control of the Einsatzgruppe and the Order Police. The Battalion's name was changed, in Lithuanian, to "Pagelbines Policijos Tarnybos Batalijones," which translates as "Auxiliary Police Service Battalion." At the same time, the Germans began referring to the Battalion, as they did for all indigenous police forces in occupied eastern countries, as the "Schutzmannschaft", which roughly translates as "protective group" or "protective force"...."

"...The Germans quickly expanded the role of the Schutzmannschaft, implementing them to help carry out the "Final Solution," that is, Hitler's plan to "cleanse" the occupied Eastern territories by interring and/or executing all Jews, partisans (of the Soviets), Gypsies and "Boisheviks," a term used mainly to describe Soviet Communists and Jews but loosely used as a catch-all for the groups named and anyone else the Germans considered to be an enemy or undesirable. Thus, during the fall of 1941, the winter of 1941-42, and the spring of 1942, the Schutzmannschaft participated and assisted in the killing of thousands of civilians, mainly Lithuanian Jews and Jews in other nearby German occupied eastern areas. ..." (No. 2:93 CV 97JM., U.S.D.C., N.D. Indiana, Hammond Division, June 18, 1997)

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(1) It is a matter of historical record that all members of the 2nd (12th) Battalion were volunteers. Example: "The members of the 2nd Battalion were volunteers and were paid in German marks." (Juozas Naujalis, Petitioner v. INS; Appeals Court decision.)

(2) Kisielaitis has admitted, on at least four (4) occasions, to having served with the 2nd (12th) Battalion. At least one admission occurred while Kisielaitis was under oath, and at least two admissions were audiotaped. The most recent admission was on July 8, 2001. (Please see: Attachments "E", "F" and "G" of this Report.)

(3) "Order No. 1" and "Order No. 42" to the 2nd Auxiliary Police Service Battalion both show Kisielaitis serving in the position of "Rifleman" with the Rank of "Recruit" (a soldier). It is important to note that both Orders specifically indicate if a Recruit is serving in a non-combat position – i.e. "joiner", "metal worker", "porter", "bootblack", "teamster" – and no such indication is shown for "Rifleman" Kisielaitis. (Please see: copies and official translations of "Order No. 1" and "Order No. 42", provided in Attachments "C" and "D" of this Report.)

Kisielaitis' Battalion, along with German military and "police" units and Lithuanian "partisan" (indigenous fascist) units, ultimately murdered approximately 94% of Lithuania's Jewish population. The "Jager Report", issued on December 1, 1941 by Colonel Jager, the Commander of Einsatzkommando 3, put the number of (mostly Jewish) Lithuanian civilians murdered to (that) date at 137,346.

On October 6, 1941, Kisielaitis' Battalion⁴, and (allegedly) Kisielaitis⁵, left Lithuania for the Minsk-Borisov-Slutsk region of Byelorussia (now Belarus). While in Byelorussia, Kisielaitis' Battalion killed at least 30,000 civilians, including thousands of children under the age of sixteen. During just October, 1941, more than 11,000 Byelorussian civilians were murdered by the 2nd (12th) Battalion.

"... On October 6, 1941, the Nazis transferred the 2nd Battalion, along with the German 11th Battalion, from Lithuania to Minsk in Byelorussia (now Belarus). Their mission was to exterminate "Bolshevism" by eliminating the remnants of the Bolshevik army and its partisans from the Minsk-Borisov-Slutsk region. According to the Nazis, "Bolshevism" and "Bolsheviks" referred to Jews and members of the Communist Party...

"... During October 1941, the 2nd Battalion assisted the German 11th Battalion in a series of killing missions in which they executed over 11,000 men, women and children...

"...The soldiers of the 2nd Battalion participated in these missions by surrounding villages, locating victims in their homes and workplaces, marching them to killing fields, forcing them to undress and lie in pits, and then shooting the victims...

"...The Battalions' "cleansing" actions in Byelorussia included the execution of at least 617 civilians in Dukara on October 8, 1941; 800 communists, Jews, and other "partisans" in the Rudensk area from October 9-11; 1,300 communists, Jews, and other "hostile" persons in Smilovichi on October 14; 625 communists from a civilian prison camp in Minsk on October 15; an additional 1,150 communists from the Minsk camp on October 18; 1,000 Jews and communists in Kojdanov on October 21; and 5,900 Jews in Slutsk on October 27-28, 1941. ..." (United States Court of Appeals, Seventh Circuit, No. 00-1518, Juozas Naujalis v. INS, Argued September 28, 2000--Decided February 15, 2001)

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(4) Please see: "Order No. 42" to the 2nd Auxiliary Police Service Battalion, Attachment "D" of this Report.

(5) Kisielaitis has repeatedly claimed to have remained behind in Lithuania when the 2nd (12th) Battalion departed for Minsk. However, "Order No. 42" clearly states (translation, page 3): "The enlisted men listed below left on assignment for the Minsk-Borisov-Slutsk areas on 6 October at 0500 hours. They must be assigned rations in the battalion as of 6 October of this year..." and shows (translation, page 16) "459. Recruit...Kisielaitis, Juozas...3rd Company" as having been with the battalion when it departed for Minsk-Borisov-Slutsk. It is important to note that Order No. 42 separately lists (translation, page 16) those soldiers who did in fact remain behind when the 12th Battalion departed for Minsk. (Please see: Order No. 42, Attachment "D" of this Report.)

On a number of occasions, the remarkable brutality of the 12th Battalion's soldiers while in Byelorussia shocked even their Nazi masters. Reich Commissioner Carl, Nazi governor of the Slutsk area, complained that the 2nd (12th) Battalion was "indescribably brutal" and wrote:

"... It suffices if I point out that persons shot but not killed have worked themselves out of their graves some time after they had been covered by dirt. In future keep this (police) battalion away from me by all means..."

The Nazi extermination squads proved to be murderously effective in Belarus. On 08 April 1943, at a conference in Minsk, SS-Obersturmfuehrer Strauch stated, regarding the numbers of Jews murdered in Byelorussia:

"... I believe, we can nonetheless be complacent that of the approximately 150,000 Jews there used to be, already 130,000 have disappeared. We have still about 22,000 in the territory of the Commissariat. Still, I pray you to effect that the Jew disappear where he is overdue... We will lower this number by half, without having economic difficulties..."

During the 1946 sessions of the "Trial of German Major War Criminals" in Nuremberg, Germany, a number of chilling captured German documents, detailing the Nazi murders in Lithuania and Byelorussia, were read into the official Nuremberg trial record (excerpts follow):

"... [Page 331] THE INTERPRETER: I now read from Page 9 of the document, an extract under the heading "C. Jews."

"... The attitude of the Jews is still clearly hostile to the Germans and criminal. It is our aim to cleanse the Eastern countries of Jews as completely as possible..."

"... [Page 332] The executions are everywhere to be carried out in such a manner that they are hardly noticeable to the public. Among the population, and even among the remaining Jews, the conviction that the Jews have merely been resettled is widespread. ..."

"... I am now omitting several paragraphs and I continue: In Lithuania there are now in Kauen still 15,000, in Schaulen 4,500 and in Wilna another 15,000 Jews who are also needed for labor purposes. In White Ruthenia the Jews are in the process of being cleaned out. The number of Jews in the part of the country which has been turned over to the civilian administration amounts to 139,000. In the meantime, 33,210 Jews have been shot by the Special Operation Group of the Security Police and the S.D. ..."

...TUESDAY, 26 FEB 1946:

COLONEL SMIRNOV: I quote one line only from the sub-paragraph entitled "Lithuania," which is on Page 173 of the document book, paragraph 3: ...

"As a result of numerous individual operations, 136,421 persons in all were liquidated. ..."

"... from the next sub-paragraph of the "A" group report, entitled "Byelorussia". I quote the last paragraph, on Page 5 of the Russian text, Page 174, last paragraph, of the document book: ..."

"... The problem of liquidating the Jews in toto, in the territory of Byelorussia after the arrival of the Germans, presented certain well-known difficulties. As a matter of fact, it was in this territory in particular that the Jews, for lack of other sources, constituted a high percentage of specialists and are therefore indispensable. Moreover, operational group "A" only took over the territory after the hard frosts had set in, a fact which hampered the carrying out of the mass executions very seriously indeed. ..."

"...A further difficulty was that the Jews were scattered all over the territory. Bearing in mind the fact that distances were vast, road conditions bad, transportation and petrol lacking, and the forces of the Security Police insignificant the mass executions could only be carried out by a maximum effort. Nevertheless, 41,000 Jews have already been shot. This figure does not include the persons executed by former operational commands ..."

"...I interrupt once more and proceed to read from the following paragraph. This corresponds to Page 175, paragraph 2, of the document book..."

"... [Page 335] To the Chief of Police in Byelorussia, Despite the difficult situation, orders have been given to solve the Jewish question as soon as possible. None the less, this calls for two months' time and depends on the weather. ..."

"... Sub-paragraph 3. Where there are no cellars and a considerable number of persons are huddled together in small underground shelters, these shelters must be broken into from outside, or else police dogs sent in (one police dog, 'Asta' put up a remarkably good performance in Pinsk), otherwise hand grenades should be thrown in, after which the Jews invariably came out of their hiding places. ..."

"... I further quote sub-paragraph 5: ..."

"... We recommend persuading very young children to disclose these hiding places by promising to spare their lives. This method has fully justified its application. ..."

During 1944, as the Soviet Army advanced westward into Lithuania, Kisielaitis fled into Germany.

During 1945, Kisielaitis was placed in a Displaced Persons (D.P.) camp in Germany.

During 1948, Kisielaitis and his family immigrated to Canada with the assistance of a Montreal-based tailors' union.

Kisielaitis became a Canadian citizen in 1953.

During 1963, Kisielaitis moved to the United States to accept employment as a foreman at the Supreme Coat Company in Worcester, Massachusetts.

During the 1970s, Kisielaitis became a partner in Cohen Tailoring, also in Massachusetts.

During 1981, the U.S. Department of Justice's Office of Special Investigations (O.S.I.) became aware of Kisielaitis' presence in the U.S. A "drop-in" interview of Kisielaitis by (then) O.S.I. staff attorney Eli Rosenbaum confirmed Kisielaitis' identity and his 2nd (12th) Battalion membership.

As a result of the overwhelming historical, documentary and testimonial evidence that members of the Lithuanian Auxiliary Police Service Battalion, individually and as a group, committed numerous war crimes⁶, a number of 2nd (12th) Battalion members residing in the United States have been denaturalized and deported through the efforts of the O.S.I.⁷ A number of other countries, including the Soviet Union (Russia), Germany, the United Kingdom and Canada⁸ have also successfully prosecuted, or are in the process of prosecuting, members of the 2nd (12th) Battalion and other WWII war criminals who murdered civilians in Lithuania and Belarus.

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(6) The Canadian Justice Department is well aware of the history of the 2nd Lithuanian Auxiliary Police Service Battalion (the 12th Schutzmannschaft Battalion). One of the better summary reports on Nazi war crimes in Byelorussia was written by Mr. Frank Buscher, a historian with the Crimes Against Humanity and War Crimes Section of Canada's Department of Justice. (Please see: Buscher Report, Attachment "I" of this Report.)

(7) Among other 2nd (12th) Battalion members deported from the U.S. are Juozas Naujalis, Kazys Ciurinskas and Jonas Stelmokas.

(8) Helmut Rauca was the first, and for 50 years the only, "Nazi" to be extradited or deported from Canada for war crimes. Rauca was a Master Sergeant in the German SS and was accused of many heinous crimes, including involvement in the execution of 11,000 Jews in a single day in Kaunas, Lithuania. Rauca was extradited to Germany where he was imprisoned pending trial. Rauca died while in a German prison.

On May 24, 1984, the U.S. Office of Special Investigations formally accused Juozas Kisielaitis of "... (assisting) the Nazis in the persecution of persons because of their race, religion, national origin or political opinion...", and served Kisielaitis with an Order to Show Cause, ordering him to appear before an Immigration Judge and show cause why he should not be deported from the United States.⁹

Rather than fight deportation from the United States, during early 1985 Kisielaitis fled back to Canada. The U.S. Department of Justice, after confirming Kisielaitis' presence in Canada, provided the Canadian Department of Justice and the R.C.M.P. with a complete copy of their files on Kisielaitis.¹⁰

It is important to note that the U.S. Government's Order to Show Cause, which resulted in Kisielaitis' departure from the United States, was signed by Mr. Neal M. Sher, (then) Director of the U.S. Department of Justice's Office of Special Investigations (O.S.I.). Mr. Sher recently served as an official Advisor to Canada's Justice Department and Canada's War Crimes Unit, and it is logical to assume that Mr. Sher has made available to the Canadian government whatever information caused the O.S.I. to order Kisielaitis' removal from the United States.

On March 5, 1985, in response to media inquiries, Joseph Krovisky, public affairs officer for the U.S. Department of Justice, publicly confirmed that Kisielaitis had departed the U.S. for Canada, and added:

"... we confirmed that (Jouzas Kisielaitis) was a war criminal living in the U.S. He entered the U.S. under false pretences, concealing his service in a Nazi unit...". (Emphasis added.)

On April 30, 1985, (former Canadian Solicitor General) Robert Kaplan made the following statement about Kisielaitis to the Canadian press:

"If the Americans have compiled a dossier of evidence, as they seem to have, the Canadian government should move to obtain it and take immediate action. I would hope they don't refer this one to the commission on war criminals in Canada."¹¹

Despite the volume of evidence (allegedly) compiled by the U.S. against Kisielaitis, reliable sources report that, during 1987, Kisielaitis was informed by the Canadian government that "no evidence" was in their possession which would allow his deportation from Canada as a war criminal.

(10) Prior to the preparation of this Report, U.S. and Canadian sources confirmed that, during 1985, "the entire file" compiled on Kisielaitis by the U.S. Department of Justice was copied and transmitted to the Canadian Justice Department.

(11) Kaplan was referring to the Commission headed by Justice Deschenes, and was apparently unaware that the United States had already provided their files on Kisielaitis to the Canadian government.

During 1996, Kiselaitis' presence in Canada was reconfirmed by Investigators, and his address was provided to the Canadian Jewish Congress (C.J.C.).

On March 18, 1997, Kiselaitis was (telephonically) (re)interviewed by an Investigator. Mr. Bernie Farber and Mr. Michael Cohen of the C.J.C. monitored the interview. In response to questioning, Kiselaitis stated that he had been "interviewed twice, 12 years ago, by the R.C.M.P.", and that he had been told that he was "a good Canadian citizen".

Following public speeches by the Investigator who had interviewed Kiselaitis, an organization of Holocaust survivors and their families held a demonstration in front of Kiselaitis' (then) residence in Burlington, Ontario. Shortly after that demonstration, Kiselaitis reportedly sold his Burlington home and moved to Cornwall, Ontario.

Kiselaitis now lives in Montreal, Quebec, a short distance from the Montreal Jewish community and a number of Lithuanian survivors of the Holocaust.

With the exception of the previously mentioned 1998 demonstration, the Canadian Jewish community has taken no known action regarding Kiselaitis' presence in Canada.

The Canadian Department of Justice recently informed representatives of the Canadian Jewish community that no further investigation of Kiselaitis is planned.

During a July 8, 2001 interview, Kiselaitis confirmed that he had been informed by the Canadian government that he would not be the subject of any deportation attempt.







Kaunas Sanciai, October 6, 1941

Formation Area

§1

I proclaim order No. 44 of 4 October, issued by the Kaunas Commandant's Office.

"1. Soldiers, the First General Councillor, General KUBILIUNAS, asked me to tell you, before you leave for your honorable venture, that previously unheard of actions of enemy destruction are going on in the East; that the reconstruction of Europe will take place under the leadership of the Great Reich's Leader after the greatest enemy of all humanity - Bolshevism - is exterminated; and that the nations of Europe will be rewarded with standing in Europe according to merits which they will earn in current battle going on under the leadership of the Great Leader ADOLF HITLER.

The General also wishes you greatest possible successes in your feats. Most of you helped the powerful Great German Army in its efforts, as partisans, to expel the Bolsheviks from our country. We have to continue contributing as much as we can to the final extermination of Bolshevism which threatened all of cultured Europe.

Soldiers, as you depart, fulfill your missions with resolute will, honesty and with honor. Always and everywhere show yourselves worthy of the noble name of a Lithuanian soldier, because you are the representatives of the entire Lithuanian nation.

2. I order the Commander of the 2nd A.P.S. battalion, according to the 3 October Order received from the Commander of the 11th Reserve Police Battalion, to leave at 0500 hours on October 6, 1941, for the Minsk-Borisov-Slutsk areas to clean these areas of the remnants of the Bolshevik army and Bolshevik partisans.

From the moment of departure, the 2nd A.P.S. battalion becomes subordinate directly to Major LECHTHALER, the Commander of the 11th Reserve Police Battalion, and must comply with all his orders.

All departing soldiers must be announced in orders issued by the battalion.

Please inform me about the departures.

Signed: Captain KVIECINSKAS, Commandant of Kaunas."

§2

According to the order of the Kaunas Commandant, I will depart today at 0500 hours with battalion units or an assignment to the Minsk-Borisov-Slutsk areas. I delegate to Captain SLIZIUS, the commander of the supply unit, general supervision and command of the battalion men remaining in the area of permanent deployment.

During the German occupation of Lithuania, I served with a Lithuanian ~~Unit~~ Auxiliary Police Service Battalion, formed and commanded by Antanas Impulevicius. I don't know what became of him after the war.

I served the Battalion ~~as a~~ as a tailor. It was the 12th Battalion, I think, in the 3rd or 4th Company.

At some time in 1941 or 1942, the whole Battalion was ordered to go to Poland and Belorussia. I know that they went to Minsk. They went to guard ~~production sites~~ from the partisans - this I know only because one of the men who went (first name Stasys) told me - I have no personal knowledge of what they did there, except for what Stasys told me. Everyone from the Battalion went, except my company. My company did not go because we were just tailors, shoemakers, and other "helpers" - none of us carried weapons, except to guard our buildings. We did not go with the rest of the Battalion, because there were not enough trucks. I remember many of the first names on Order #42 - but I don't recall the last names of anyone I served with.

~~We were given ID cards (little ones) - all of us in the Battalion.~~ I see my listing on "Order #42" as a "junior soldier" and that sounds correct. I joined when the Battalion was first formed by Impulevicius, but I was never an officer.

I have read the above statement, and it has been read to me as well. I understand it, and I hereby swear, under penalty of perjury, that the statement above is the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth. No promises or threats have been made in order to obtain this statement from me.



ALLEGATIONS

Upon inquiry conducted by the Office of Special Investigations of the United States Department of Justice, it is alleged that:

1. You are not a citizen or national of the United States.
2. You are a native of Lithuania and a citizen of Canada.
3. On or about July 11, 1963, you executed an Application for Immigration Visa and Alien Registration (Form FS-510) at the American Consulate General at Montreal, Canada, wherein you claimed eligibility for admission to the United States under the Immigration and Nationality Act, 8 U.S.C. §1101 et seq.
4. You were admitted to the United States for permanent residence on August 20, 1963, at Highgate Springs, Vermont upon presentation of an Immigrant Visa and Alien Registration I-1817962 (Number 1 Lithuania), which was issued on or about July 11, 1963, by the American Consulate General at Montreal, Canada, pursuant to the Immigration and Nationality Act,

Section 221, 8 U.S.C. §1201.

5. In or about June 1941, the forces of Nazi Germany invaded and occupied Lithuania.

6. In or about Summer 1941, in Kaunas, Lithuania you became a member of the 12th Lithuanian Schutzmannschaft Battalion (a successor to the 2d Auxiliary Police Service Battalion) which throughout its existence acted under the direction of and in association with the Nazi government of Germany.

7. The 12th Lithuanian Schutzmannschaft Battalion assisted the Nazi occupying forces in the areas of Kaunas and Minsk-Borisov-Slutsk (Byelorussia) in persecuting Jews and other civilians. Such persecution included inter alia, the arrest, detention and murder of civilians in Kaunas during the period of summer and fall 1941 and thereafter, and in Minsk-Borisov-Slutsk during the period of fall and winter 1941-1942.

8. As a member of the 12th Lithuanian Schutzmannschaft Battalion, you assisted the Nazis in the persecution of persons because of their race, religion, national origin or political opinion.

9. When you applied for admission to the United States in 1963, and in order to procure your Immigrant Visa and Alien Registration I-1817962 (Number 1 Lithuania) or other documentation, or in order to seek your entry into the United States, you stated to American immigration authorities that you were a tailor in Kaunas, Lithuania from 1938 to 1945, and

that you had never been a member of any political, professional, vocational, or social organizations. In so doing, you willfully misrepresented the material facts of your membership and activities in the 12th Lithuanian Schutzmannschaft Battalion.

10. In statements made under oath by you on December 17, 1981, and March 1, 1982, you admitted to United States Government officials, that you had been a member of the 12th Lithuanian Schutzmannschaft Battalion.

CHARGES

ON THE BASIS OF THE FOREGOING ALLEGATIONS, it is charged that you are subject to deportation pursuant to the following provisions of law;

1. Section 241(a)(1) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1251(a)(1)) - You sought to and did procure a visa or other documentation, or sought to and did enter the United States, by fraud, or by willfully misrepresenting material facts. In so doing, you were a member of the class of aliens ineligible to receive visas and should have been excluded from the United States under Section 212(a)(19) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1182(a)(19)).

2. Section 241(a)(1) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1251(a)(1)) - You sought to and did procure a visa or other documentation, or sought to and did enter the United States, by fraud, or by willfully

misrepresenting material facts. Thus, at the time of your application for admission to the United States, you were not in possession of a valid expired immigrant visa, and should therefore have been excluded under Section 212(a)(20) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1182(a)(20)).

3. Section 241(a)(2) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1251(a)(2)) - You sought to and did procure a visa or other documentation, or sought to and did enter the United States, by fraud, or by willfully misrepresenting material facts. Thus, you were excludable at the time of entry and are in the United States in violation of Section 212(a)(19) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1182(a)(19)).

4. Section 241(a)(2) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1251(a)(2)) - You sought to and did procure a visa or other documentation, or sought to and did enter the United States, by fraud, or by willfully misrepresenting material facts. Thus, at the time of your application for admission to the United States, you were not in possession of a valid unexpired immigrant visa, and so entered and are in the United States in violation of Section 212(a)(20) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1182(a)(20)).

5. Section 241(a)(19) of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952, as amended (8 U.S.C. §1251(a)(19)) -

You ordered, incited, assisted, or otherwise participated in the persecution of persons because of race, religion, national origin, or political opinion between on or about June 1941, and on or about May 1944 under the direction of or in association with the Nazi government of Germany.

WHEREFORE, YOU ARE ORDERED to appear before an Immigration Judge of the Executive Office for Immigration Review of the United States Department of Justice at the John Fitzgerald Kennedy Federal Building, Government Center, Boston, Massachusetts 02203 on June 7, 1984, at 1:00, p.m., and show cause why you should not be deported from the United States on the charges set forth above.

**Investigating Nazi Crimes in Byelorussia:
Challenges and Lessons**

Since May 1992 I have worked as a historian for the Crimes Against Humanity and War Crimes Section of Canada's Department of Justice.

Like my colleague Howard Margolian, I have been in the fortunate position to research the Holocaust and other German crimes as a historian and as a member of an official war crimes investigations team. One of the first lessons I learned was that, while there are many similarities, considerable differences exist between the two occupations. Prosecutors and courts are not interested in historiographical schools and erudite speculation; they want the facts of a case. After a few weeks at the Section, I began to write like a policeman or a prosecutor, dealing exclusively with what could be proven on the basis of witness testimony and documentary evidence and paying attention to the minutest detail rather than speculating what might have been and identifying historical trends. To be sure, like the other historians, I have continued to write more traditional research papers. However, these have been written as historical background reports for the Section's attorneys and always with a view toward obtaining convictions or denaturalizations instead of making contributions to the body of academic knowledge.

It is now almost 51 years after the end of the Second World War. It is safe to say that the era of war crimes investigations spawned by this conflict is nearing its end. At this time, Australia has already closed its Special Investigations Unit. Its Canadian, U.S. and German counterparts are still operating, although they will undoubtedly close their doors within the next few years. British authorities recently filed suit against Serafimovich, the chief of a Byelorussian indigenous police unit. His case may well be the last western war crimes trial. Therefore, this conference offers us an opportunity to take stock of what has been learned during the past five decades and to discuss what remains to be discovered. The territory for which I have been responsible as a war crimes researcher is Byelorussia and I would like to use this territory as the basis for my paper. Consequently, I think it would be best if I provided you first with some general information about Byelorussia under Nazi occupation and the crimes committed by the occupiers and their indigenous helpers.

Nazi Germany invaded the Soviet Union on June 22, 1941, without warning or justification, along a front stretching in excess of 1,000 miles. The German attack - code-named Operation "Barbarossa" - was carried out by three Army Groups: North, Center and South. Based on the premise that Germany's forces would inflict a crushing defeat on the Soviet Red Army by the fall, the plans called for Army Group Center to take Byelorussia and its capital Minsk on the way to the final conquest of Smolensk and Moscow.

Successfully employing blitzkrieg tactics, German tank and motorized armored divisions did in fact inflict humiliating defeats on the enemy and conquer vast amounts of Byelorussian territory within a matter of days. Minsk fell to the invaders as early as the end of June and by mid-July almost the entire Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic was under German control. (1)

Administratively, the territory of Byelorussia, which the Germans called "WeiBruthenien (White Ruthenia)," was divided into two main areas for most of the German occupation. (2) Roughly the eastern third comprised the rear area of Army Group Center and was administered by the military. The western two-thirds was put under civilian administration by the Reichs Ministry for the Occupied Eastern Territories (RmfdbO) in September 1941 and named the Generalkommissariat WeiBruthenien. The dividing line between civil and military administration ran north to south approximately 50 km east of Minsk, roughly from Disna to Borisov to Petrikov. Expecting that the front would continue to move eastward, civilian officials believed that they would soon take over the eastern districts from the military as well. However, military reality, i.e. the failure of the German forces to advance farther to the East for any extended period of time, prevented the Generalkommissariat's take-over of Byelorussia in its entirety and thus the eastern third remained in Army Group Center's rear area. In this manner, Byelorussia endured three years - from June 1941 until August 1944 - of Nazi occupation.

Byelorussia's Jewish population numbered almost 1.1 million on the eve of the German invasion. In fact, many of Byelorussia's largest cities - Minsk, Vitebsk, Mogilev, Gomel, Bobruisk, Orsha - had Jewish majorities. The invading Germans began the murder of Byelorussian Jews soon after their arrival. Jews who were not killed during the initial operations were forced to move into ghettos. These ghettos were systematically liquidated from the fall of 1941 to the fall of 1943. German authorities also accused the Jews of being the driving force behind the Soviet partisan movement, whose members began to operate in growing numbers behind German lines in the spring of 1942. For example, Wilhelm Kube, the Commissar General for White Ruthenia, equated Jews with partisans in the same report in which he proudly told his superiors about the murder of 55,000 Byelorussian Jews during a ten-week period in the spring and summer of 1942. (3)

Most Nazi crimes in Byelorussia, particularly the murder of Byelorussian Jewry, were committed by mobile forces. Units belonging to two of Heydrich's Einsatzgruppen - A and B - were operating in Byelorussia. They received assistance from regular German police battalions and Waffen-SS units. To be sure, some of the Einsatzgruppen headquarters became stationary at the end of 1941 for the purpose of establishing an SS/police structure in the occupied Soviet Union. Yet, the occupiers' killing operations never really lost their mobile character throughout the occupation owing to the expanse of the areas to which these forces were assigned.

After the war, members of the Einsatzgruppen were the subjects of several trials, most notably that of Otto Ohlendorf and 20 other officers before a U.S. military tribunal from July 1947 to April 1948. (4) Beginning in 1950 West German courts also tried Einsatzgruppen men. (5) In addition to the courts, historians also began to investigate the Einsatzgruppen and publish their findings. (6)

While the history of the Einsatzgruppen is by now well-documented, the same cannot be said for most of the indigenous units who assisted the Germans in the murder of Soviet Jews and gentiles. Some - like the Arjas Commando, the Kaminsky Brigade and the SS unit "Druzhina" - have attained great notoriety. However, historians have paid little attention to the large numbers of lesser-known indigenous "security" forces without which the Germans would have encountered greater difficulty in liquidating entire ghettos and staging massive murder and pillage operations disguised as anti-partisan actions. The Germans established two types of local units: the Schutzmannschaft and the Ordnungsdienst. The former generally operated in areas under civilian administration and fell within the SS/police command structure; the latter was established in army and army group rear areas and placed under the authority of local and district military commanders. Historians have only recently begun to study the Schutzmannschaften and the Ordnungsdienst. (7)

Large numbers of indigenous forces were active in Byelorussia. A compilation of forces stationed in the area of the Higher SS and Police Leader for Russia-Center and White Ruthenia dated May 1, 1943, lists 19 indigenous Schutzmannschaften. Of these, 17 were assigned to the SS and Police Leader for White Ruthenia in Minsk. (8) Four were Lithuanian, two Latvian, three Byelorussian, seven Ukrainian, and one - SS unit "Druzhina" - consisted of 2,000 Russians and Ukrainians who distinguished themselves for their extremely brutal conduct during a major anti-partisan operation code-named "Cottbus" in May and June 1943. (9) These forces were mobile, although it must be stressed that the Germans also established large numbers of stationary Schutzmannschaften whose operations were limited to specific towns or districts. The commanders of mobile Schutzmannschaften were German police or gendarmerie officers, while the rank-and-file consisted of indigenous volunteers. Most mobile Schutzmannschaften were battalions with personnel strengths between 350 and 450; the personnel strengths of stationary Schutzmannschaften were usually lower. As a result of desertions and casualties suffered in battles with Soviet partisans, there was considerable turnover. Consequently, the number of those who served in a given Schutzmannschaft throughout its history is undoubtedly much higher than the number of those who joined initially. (10)

There is considerable documentary evidence and witness testimony to establish the participation of Schutzmannschaften in the commission of Nazi crimes. From the outset, their members took part in the murder of Jews and gentiles. For example, in October and November 1941 Lithuanian Schutzmannschaft Battalion 12 killed thousands of civilians in cities and towns throughout central Byelorussia.

Attached to German Police Reserve Battalion 11, it participated in the murder of the Jewish population of Slutsk. The brutality of the forces carrying out the executions was such that the leading German civilian administrator in Slutsk sent a lengthy report to his superior, strongly protesting the conduct of the police forces. (11)

Considerably less evidence exists with respect to the Ordnungsdienst's participation in Nazi crimes. However, there are numerous indications that its role transcended that of a simple indigenous security force for the military's rear areas. For example, the commander of Army Group Center Rear Area, General Max von Schenckendorff, described the Ordnungsdienst as "first and foremost an organ of the SD." (12) More telling, though, is a document referring to Ordnungsdienst men in Chaussy as guarding "abandoned Jewish furniture." (13) Similarly, Feldkommandantur (district military headquarters) (V)200 in the Dobrush-Klincy area reported that the indigenous unit it had established was guarding Jews. (14) Further, one of the first explicit duties of the OD in Smolensk was "to control the Jewry," particularly by preventing Jews from settling outside the ghetto which the invaders had established (15). Clearly, then, both the Schutzmannschaften and the Ordnungsdienst warrant further historical inquiry to clarify issues such as organization, duties, membership, local variations, involvement in criminal activity etc.

One of the main tasks of indigenous forces was to assist the Germans in the "pacification" of the occupied areas. This included combating the growing Soviet partisan movement. SS and police officials regularly used mobile Schutzmannschaft forces during many major anti-partisan operations in Byelorussia. The operational orders and battle reports filed by SS and police commanders like Curt von Gottberg leave no doubt as to Schutzmannschaft involvement. The vast majority of such operations were launched to terrorize, plunder and decimate the local gentile population and, of course, to murder the remaining Jews. Some, like the above-mentioned Operation "Cottbus" or Operation "Hermann," resulted in heinous crimes committed by German and indigenous police forces. German records show that old men, women and children were routinely herded into barns which were subsequently set on fire. In fact, German civilian administrators were very concerned about the impact of such atrocities on the surviving civilian population. One report described the political effects of the killing of innocent Byelorussian women and children as "disastrous." (16)

The Germans did not rely solely on major operations to combat the partisans. In fact, much of their war against the movement took place in countless smaller battles. Such encounters usually did not involve large indigenous forces. Nonetheless, native collaborators were crucial to this effort as well. The outcome was identical to that of the large operations: dead villagers, devastated villages, plundered livestock and crops. The crimes committed as part of the occupiers' war against partisans, and particularly the involvement of indigenous personnel, calls for further historical research. What motivated some Soviet citizens to take up arms against and take part in the brutal slaughter and plunder of their fellow-countrymen?

Who did most of the dirty work, the Germans or their local helpers? How did many of those who served in indigenous units manage to settle in western countries after the war and lead normal lives? Why have western governments and courts been largely unsuccessful in bringing these men to justice? Historians have yet to provide answers to these questions.

Soviet courts were much more active and successful in this area. Large numbers of indigenous collaborators were tried and convicted before tribunals of the Soviet secret police, the NKVD and its successors. They began their work during the closing months of the war, lasting well into the 1980s. Their modus operandi, particularly their utter disregard for the rights of defendants, appears appalling in the west. Further, one cannot escape the impression that these trials served a political purpose as well as justice; Stalin's and later governments undoubtedly wished to impress the cost of treason on the Soviet population. (17)

I have examined many volumes of Soviet trial records in the course of my work. All of these proceedings dealt with indigenous collaborators; some held relatively high ranks, most were rank-and-file members of Schutzmannschaften or Ordnungsdienst units. The tribunal records of the late 1940s and early 1950s are remarkably short, typically consisting of one, perhaps two volumes. Almost all trials involved multiple defendants. They were preceded by lengthy interrogations on the part of the secret police. At times, defendants were subjected to 20 or more sessions of intense questioning. The vast majority of defendants broke down, admitting their guilt and implicating numerous others, who were promptly arrested or, if they could not be located, became the subjects of systematic investigations into their whereabouts. Surprisingly, even during Stalin's day, only a minority of defendants received the death penalty; most were sentenced to ten or twenty-five years in a labor camp. Many of these defendants benefited from Khrushchev's amnesty.

Over time, the records of Soviet trials became longer. By the 1980s many consisted of multi-volume sets. The proceedings continued to involve multiple-defendants and numerous, lengthy pre-trial interrogations. However, the newer records include considerably more evidence than those produced during Stalin's last years. For example, many feature copies of crucial captured German documents as well as photographs of the scene of the crime. Prosecutors also incorporated the testimony of survivors to a greater extent, in contrast to earlier trials which had relied for the most part on the testimony of indigenous collaborators who had served in the same unit as the accused.

If the Soviet successor states ever decide to open these records to the public, they would without doubt constitute valuable historical sources. To be sure, western scholars would have to exercise caution, taking into account Soviet legal practices and the trials' political and propagandistic functions.

Nonetheless, such records would enhance our knowledge and understanding of indigenous collaborators and their units as well as their involvement in the murder of Jewish and gentile civilians.

Western scholars will also benefit from the countless captured German documents stored in archives throughout the former Soviet Union. I have visited and examined the holdings of the State Central Archive in Minsk and all six State Regional Archives in the Republic of Belarus, located at Minsk, Brest, Grodno, Vitebsk, Mogilev, and Gomel. Three - Vitebsk, Mogilev, and Gomel - are best suited for research on German military administration in general and the Ordnungsdienst in particular. One - Grodno - contains numerous files relating to Bezirk Bialystok. The remaining archives hold documents on all aspects of the civilian administration; SS/police in the Generalkommissariat White Ruthenia, including Schutzmannschaften; the treatment of the indigenous population; the murder and systematic plunder of the Jews; the reaction of gentiles to the murder of the Jews etc. Three of the documents which have touched me personally the most are located in Minsk and Brest. One deals with a Jewish boy and a Soviet POW who were executed twice. The first execution was botched and both were able to free themselves from their grave despite serious injuries. The two were captured several days later and shot again. (18) The second discusses the shooting of an entire gypsy family as partisans. According to the German gendarmerie official who reported the execution, three adults and five children were shot. The youngest "partisan" was two months old. (19) The third describes the behavior of gentiles in Minsk during a Judenaktion in November 1942. Local Byelorussians seized the apartments and property of Jews while the ghetto was still being cleared and apparently displayed such rapacity that the police had difficulty controlling the situation. (20)

In conclusion, the historical profession has made enormous strides over the years in its investigation of the Holocaust and other Nazi crimes. Raoul Hilberg, Yehuda Bauer, Richard Breitman, Christopher Browning, Helmut Krausnick and many others have made significant contributions. At the same time, much remains to be learned and numerous sources remain to be examined. Thus, Holocaust research should continue with great intensity in the future.
